The feast of Pentecost is not about speaking in one common language but rather about speaking intelligible and clearly so that people can understand.

It is about being, in the words of John's gospel, an advocate for those in need. The church is called to be a spokesperson for the poor, for the marginalized, for the disenfranchised for the teeming number of refugees, for those who are in need of food and work. Yesterday, Pope Francis saw to the beatification of one of those heralds of the poor. Archbishop Oscar Romero who was martyred while celebrating Mass and preaching to the people of El Salvador was formally pronounced Blessed. Archbishop Romero spoke for the people; He told them: "Each one of you has to be God's microphone"
