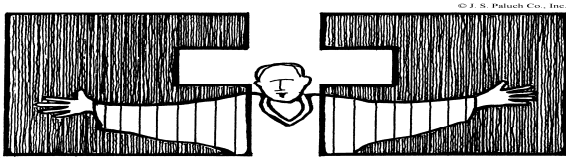

Sacred Heart Fall Festival

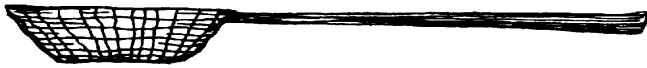
