It has been a tradition in the Catholic Church to hand out blessed chalk on the Feast of the Epiphany as part of blessing one's home in the New Year. Blessed chalk will be available for you to take home after Mass this Sunday.

Use the blessed chalk to write

20 + C + M + B + 18

above the doorways, 2018 for the year; C, M, B for the three Magi – Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar – and for *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*, Latin for “May Christ bless this house.” The following prayer is said:

Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
