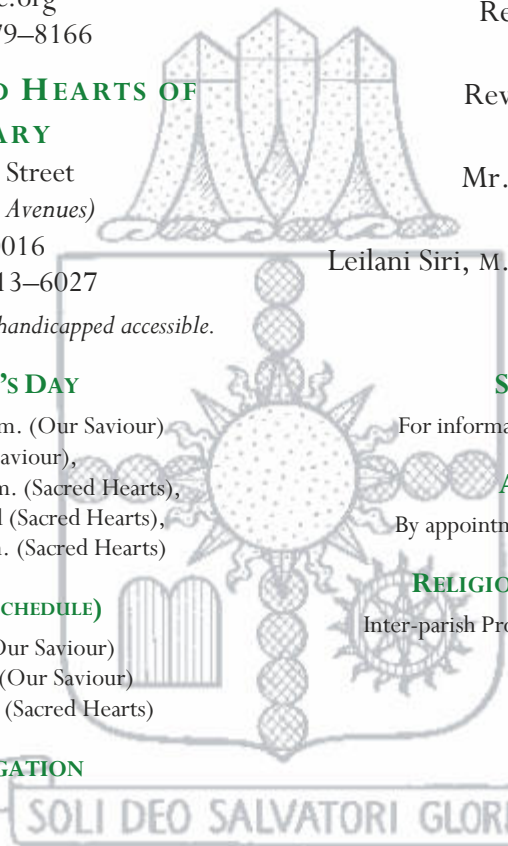

## SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“The good Shepherd gives his life for the sheep.” In those countries of the East where our Lord appeared, the office of a shepherd is not only a lowly and simple office, and an office of trust, as it is with us, but, moreover, an office of great hardship and of peril. Our flocks are exposed to no enemies, such as our Lord describes. The Shepherd here has no need to prove his fidelity to the sheep by encounters with fierce beasts of prey. The hireling shepherd is not tried. But where our Lord dwelt in the days of his flesh it was otherwise. There it was true that the good Shepherd gives his life for the sheep ... Our Lord found the sheep scattered; or, as he had said shortly before, “All that ever came before me are thieves and robbers”; and in consequence the sheep had no guide. Such were the priests and rulers of the Jews when Christ came; so that “when he saw the multitudes he was moved with compassion on them, because they fainted, and were scattered abroad as sheep having no shepherd.”

## SAINT SHARBEL MAKHLUF – 24 JULY

Born in a Lebanese mountain village in 1828, Youssef was drawn to the life of his uncles, who were monks of the Maronite rite, but his peasant mother wanted her youngest child to work in the fields. At age 23, he left home for the monastery, taking the name Sharbel, after an early martyr. He was ordained a priest in 1859 and spent the next 16 years in the monastery at Annaya, working, fasting, and praying. From 1875, he lived as a hermit, praying ceaselessly, until his death in 1898. Regarded as a saint by those who knew him, he was canonized in 1977 and is the first Maronite saint included in the Latin rite calendar. A chapel was recently dedicated to St. Sharbel at St. Patrick’s Cathedral. The chapel is situated along the northeastern corridor of the Cathedral, near the Lady Chapel.
