Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jubilee Year of Mercy.

During this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Pope Francis calls us to share with everyone the tender compassion of God that we ourselves have experienced. In today's Gospel, Luke uses a special Greek word conveying just such tenderness. In the other Gospels, Jesus calls the disciples to be "fishers," *haleis*, the same word that means catching fish with hooks or nets, to be killed and eaten. But Luke uses *zogron*, from *zoe* or "life," meaning "catch or gather people alive," as animal lovers capture without harming, rescue from "the wild" for a better life, and protect in aquarium or zoo, tenderly cared for by professionals committed to the creatures' well-being. So in Luke's vision—and Pope Francis' as well—we who have been "caught alive" by God's mercy ourselves are to become "missionaries of mercy" during this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, rescuing fellow sinners from danger and gathering them into Jesus' community to enjoy fullness of life.

Fasting and Abstinence for Catholics in the U.S.


During Lent, Catholics in the United States **abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. They fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.**

To **abstain from meat** on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent means not to eat meat on those days. It does not include the omission of eggs or dairy products.

The **required fast** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday involves eating only one full meal on those days. One or two smaller meals may be taken on those days, but may not total one full meal. The required fast does not allow eating anything between meals.

All Catholics who have completed their fourteenth year are bound by the law of abstinence; all adults are bound by the law of fast up to the beginning of their sixtieth year.

Nevertheless, pastors and parents are to see to it that minors who are not bound by the law of fast and abstinence are educated in an authentic sense of penance. ~Code of Canon Law, #1252


R.C.I.A.

This **Thursday, February 11**, Marlyn Schima will talk about the meaning and traditions of Lent. The following week our topic will be *Temptation, Sin and Reconciliation*.

Anyone desiring to become a Catholic is welcome to begin the Inquiry Process on Thursday evenings at 7:30. Inquiry sessions are available year-round, except for holidays, and new participants are welcome at any time. Whether you have decided to become a Catholic, wish to learn more about the Church, or just have questions that you would like to discuss, we encourage you to join us. There is no obligation at this stage of the RCIA process, but for those who desire to continue to the reception of sacraments, the process usually takes a minimum of one year.

Lenten Reflection Series

Beginning **Wednesday, February 24**, we will begin a 3-week series called *Priest, Prophet, King*, based on the video presentations of Auxiliary Bishop of Los Angeles,



Robert Barron. This is an in-depth study of the roles of Christ and how they fulfill the prophecies of the Jewish Scriptures. Join us on Wednesday evenings during the heart of Lent to deepen our knowledge of Jesus through these presentations and group discussion. We will meet in the Ministry Center Library from 7:30 to 9 p.m. For those who wish, a workbook with additional reading and study questions will be available for \$20.00. The series can also be beneficial without the workbook.

What was happening in the Fifth Century?

Augustine wrote extensively on the matters of grace and sin, developing the doctrine of Original Sin, inherited from Adam and Eve. He taught that all people were born with an inherent tendency toward sin, concupiscence, which could be overcome only by grace from God. Without God's grace, humanity was

condemned and had no hope of salvation.

Not everyone agreed with Augustine, and among those was a monk named Pelagius. Although not absolutely certain, it appears that Pelagius was born in Roman Britain in or around 384 AD. Pelagius lived such an ascetical life of devotion that he was known as Pelagius the Pious, and even those who would become his theological opponents would describe him as saintly. However, his writings began to challenge the beliefs of the Church, and, especially as expanded after his death, became known as Pelagianism.

Pelagianism was unlike most of the previous heresies of Christianity. It had nothing to do with the Divine Essence, the relationships within the Trinity, or the Nature of Christ. This heresy had more to do with humans than with God. Augustine taught that mankind was totally corrupted by Original Sin which was inherited from one generation to the next, and could be saved only by divine grace, which was transformative. Pelagius, on the other hand, believed that human nature in its own essence had the ability to choose between good and evil. Pelagius did not deny that God's grace existed, and that it could be beneficial, but he, or at least his followers, taught that grace was unnecessary. A human being, by his or her own will without divine aid, could choose to do what was good, avoid what was evil, and achieve salvation.

This has far-reaching effects. Taken to extremes, as it did with those who followed Pelagius, it meant that the sacraments, including baptism, were unnecessary. In fact, Pelagianism later opposed the baptism of infants, since they were unable to commit personal sin, and denied Augustine's doctrine that Original Sin affects all persons and is inherited at conception. Pelagianism also denies that virtue and good works are done by the power of the Holy Spirit, but that a person's will can on its own discern and choose what is good. It denies that it is a human impossibility to avoid sin altogether and that grace is the only antidote to sin, as Augustine taught. At its most extreme, it even denies the need for a church at all, since human beings can achieve their own salvation without the assistance of God's grace or the sacraments of the church. The monk Pelagius himself was at the more moderate end of this spectrum of beliefs, but his followers expanded on these ideas, taking them to the point of heresy.

Pelagianism was first challenged at a local Council at Diopolis in 415 AD, but at that Council found to be within the bounds of Orthodoxy and permitted. It was again addressed, three years later, in 418 AD at another local Council held at Carthage in North Africa. At this council, Pelagianism was declared to be heretical and eight canons were established intended to contradict Pelagian teaching and provide clarity to the faithful. The Ecumenical Council of Ephesus in 431 AD ratified the decision of Carthage and the eight canons.

Augustine devoted more than twenty years writing against the teaching of Pelagius.

Another movement of a modified version of Pelagius' ideas rose up some time later and was known as semi-Pelagianism. Elements from this were still being debated at the time of the Protestant Reformation.

And, so the history of the Church continues...

Así que en la visión de Lucas y también la del Papa Francisco, nosotros que hemos sido “atrapados vivos” por la misericordia de Dios nosotros mismos nos convertimos en “misioneros de la misericordia” durante este *Año Jubilar de la Misericordia*, rescatando a nuestros próximos pecadores del peligro y reuniéndolos en la comunidad de Jesús para disfrutar de la plenitud de la vida.
