

## From the Pastor's Desk

We Listened, You Spoke, and We are trying to Respond. A couple of things came together around the same time. First, a visitor to our parish who came for a wedding tripped on the blue-stone walk from the front of the church to the parking lot. Second, a couple of statements by parishioners spoke about having trouble with the stairs and walkways of the main entrance to our Church. Because this issue dealt with safety issues, I decided that steps should be taken to correct the situation as soon as possible and not be put off to the fall.

So step one was to realign all the existing bluestone walk-ways on the church and rectory property. The front steps of the church were fixed and plans are in the works for strengthening the existing iron railings and adding an additional one.

In an effort to increase the space for congregating after Mass, at least during nice weather, it was suggested that since we were dealing with the bluestone it might be the correct time to add additional space by duplicating the space on the left with a matching space on the right. That is why some bushes were removed and the area was leveled so that additional blue-stone could be added. During the changes, one parishioner pointed out the need for even more work so that those using one of the railings could do so more easily. This request was also accommodated. The bushes separating our property from the town parking lot will remain providing safety as well as a clear demarcation of our property line.

If people start using the open space between the church and the rectory front lawn then we might invest in a few benches that might increase the use of this open space for those whose ankles can withstand walking on an uneven lawn.

While the above work was in progress, two separate parishioners mentioned that neither the Rectory nor the Cenacle are handicap accessible. Plans are being drawn to address this issue and as soon as we can afford to pay for this critical improvement we will put the job out for bids.

## Words of Pope Francis

### TOO DEEP FOR WORDS

In today's reading from Romans, Paul gives us a beautiful reflection on the role of the Spirit in Christian prayer. We sometimes feel that we don't know how to pray. We just don't know what to say. Paul assures us that we need not worry. The Spirit within us intercedes for us. We don't need fancy methods or elegant words. What we need is openness to the Spirit, a willingness to let the Spirit pray within us. Paul says that the Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. He's referring to that deep longing that we have for God. The Spirit in us gives expression to that longing. We are not alone in prayer. God knows the longing we have within us even if we have within us even if we don't know how to express it.




