## MASSENA/LOUISVILLE PARISH NEWS

### PASTORAL PLANNING

The question was asked on more than one occasion: "is the move with St. Lawrence Church (becoming seasonal) an intermediate step toward outright closure of the Church?" It's an understandable question. The short answer is, "No." Now for a little lengthier response . . .

Much consideration went into this move - more than what can be adequately summed up in this space. But a few main points may be helpful:

1. Attendance at St. Lawrence for the 6pm Saturday Evening Mass averages around 50-80 people through the summer months. It dips to about 20-30 people in the winter months.
2. Rescheduling a "more popular time" for St. Lawrence would entail taking a time during the school year in which our Faith Formation Program is designed to dovetail with the Mass times in the village of Massena, where we have the facilities and resources (including people) available to accommodate a consolidated Faith Formation program.
3. There had been a considerable amount of discussion and advocacy for a Sunday evening Mass to accommodate busy families who are on the run through the weekends - and offer Confirmation students an opportunity to attend Mass before Sunday evening class. It is not feasible to add a sixth Mass to the weekend schedule - one of the other Masses would have to be set aside if a Sunday evening Mass is to be offered. A "seasonal" Sunday evening Mass during the school year months, cyclically alternating with a "seasonal" St. Lawrence Mass during the summer months makes sense.
4. This arrangement is in no way to be considered a step in the direction of "outright closure" of St. Lawrence - "seasonal" does not mean "closure." The summer population and rise in weekend Mass attendance by seasonal residents and campers in the area remains a good rationale to remain open in the summer.
5. During the winter months, if a family requests a funeral for a loved one, the Church will be opened up for this purpose. Additionally, we will continue to offer Mass on Christmas Eve at St. Lawrence.

## Reflections of Who We Are

As the population of Massena grew, the number of Catholics also increased and it was decided that a new church building was needed, and another parish formed. So in 1919 plans were undertaken to fund the new building for Sacred Heart Parish. At the same time a new parish by the name of St. Mary was founded with Rev. John M. Bellamy as first pastor. Parish lines were strictly drawn up, so that all residences south of the Grasse River and West of North Main St. belonged to Sacred Heart Parish, and the rest belonged to St. Mary's Parish.

Masses at St. Mary parish were held in a building on Liberty Ave., which also housed the A. Cappione Bottling works. In 1920 the foundation was laid for St. Mary's church which was planned as a two story structure with the church on the first floor and school rooms on the second floor. It was one of two buildings in New York State at the time with that type of plan. It was thought that at some future date a new church building would be built and the entire building would be used as a school. The basement was used for parish functions and Father Bellamy had the first movie theater in Massena. The basement was also used as a school gym, and for famous Bingo games, which packed the basement as well as the school rooms upstairs. It was also the site of Father Bellamy's boxing boys.

In 1922, the foundation was laid for the new Sacred Heart church building, but before the actual construction of the church building began on April 7, 1924, the houses that were located on the chosen lot were moved to Winter St., and can be seen at the end of the church parking lot. One of those houses was designated as the "sexton's" house and Gerald Cullen lived there as part of his salary until he purchased it.

The church wall was constructed entirely of field stones which were picked from local fields and brought on site by horse and wagon. Most of the work was done by volunteers whose wages consisted of a bowl of soup, and sandwiches. They started work at dawn and worked until dark. Needless to say the work was tedious because the rocks had to be picked carefully to sort out any limestone that might be found.

Msgr. Holland being a forward looking priest chose the highest point in Massena for the building, so the tower could be seen from any approach to Massena, the height of the belfry cross is 180 feet. There is an 8 foot statue of the Sacred Heart located 90 feet from street level on the belfry. The length of the building is 158 feet, the width of the nave is 63 feet wide at the back (west end) and is 85 feet wide on the inside, whose height is 50 feet. Its design is based on 13th century Gothic style. The only wood in the construction is found in the roof boards, the rest is local field stone, steel and concrete. The walls are 18 inches thick. The ceiling is covered with an acoustical material to prevent any type of echo within the church.

The Nave windows were installed at the time of construction and depict scenes from the New Testament. The Clerestory windows were originally frosted glass. The present stained glass windows which depict scenes from the Old Testament were installed by Father John M. Bellamy, according to the original plans of Msgr. Holland. A description of the windows will be given at a later time. The stained glass windows were called the "poor man's Bible".

The first Mass was held Christmas Eve of 1924 with Msgr. Holland as celebrant. This was the first time the Estey organ, purchased from Burlington VT for \$6000.00 was used. It was originally in a theater in New York City, and was played during silent movies.

Sacred Heart School was built in 1930, at a cost of \$125,000. As a result the public school budget was cut by \$21,000 and six teachers were released.

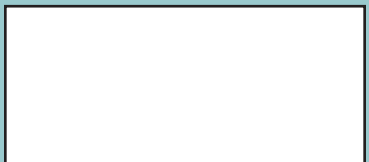
