Pastor's Letter

Dear Parish Family,

"This is my Son, my Chosen One. Listen to Him." These meaningful words spoken by the Almighty Lord of the Universe directs our attention to the one and only Savior He has sent to be our salvation. Are we listening to Him? There are many distractions today which keep us from listening to God: business demands, newspapers, television, computer, movies, meetings, etc. In the midst of it all, the mind can hardly find time to listen quietly to the Spirit of God within or to the Word of God in Holy Scriptures. The voice of the Father commanding us to listen to His beloved Son goes almost unheeded, or if listened to, only in a hurried, superficial way. Another factor keeping us from listening to Christ and his Gospel message is simply lethargy. Listening seriously to God's voice and endeavoring to read the Word of God attentively takes energy and concentrated effort. Listening to the voice of Jesus means serious examination of conscience, a thorough change of heart, true interior desire for amendment of one's sinful ways. Finally, we sometimes don't want to listen because of hostility or preferring to go our own way.

Yet, man was made for happiness that is not merely temporal but everlasting. We will not be happy if we reject Christ, or if we do not listen to Him. Lent is the time to examine our dispositions, our aims, and our strivings. Lent is the opportunity to undergo a change and come out renewed in the transforming death and resurrection of Jesus. Lent is calling us to listen carefully to the voice of Jesus, and set right our relations to God and our neighbors.

The capital campaign, "We Are Living Stones", is taking place all across our Archdiocese. We are participating to support our retired priests, educate and form our seminarians, create a Catholic School tuition endowment, and fund leadership development programs for priests and laity in our parish and across the Archdiocese. Most importantly, this campaign will help St. Andrew's parish raise funds needed to address some very important issues here at our parish. As members of our parish family, we each have an obligation to take care of our home here, and each one of us must do our part. We need to address our speaker system, repair our leaking roof, fix the steps and retaining walls that are not structurally sound, and renovate the house on campus to have it for parish use.

It is with this aim that we are asking every family to consider a pledge of 4 years to this historic campaign. At \$2.00 a day, less than a Dunkin' Donuts coffee, it would equal \$3,000 and that will help us accomplish these projects. As your pastor, I am making a sacrificial pledge myself for this campaign. I would not ask anything from you unless I myself am willing to do the same. If you cannot afford to pledge \$3,000 dollars, we will be grateful with whatever pledge you and your family can make. Any gift of any size will be welcomed, and appreciated. Please, prayerfully, consider supporting this project, as it affects all of us.
