WELCOME: We warmly welcome all to join us in worship of our God. If you are new to our parish community, please be sure to tell Fr. Pat that you will be joining our parish community. Contact the parish office if you have any questions. Visitor envelopes are available at all entrances.

MARRIAGE: Christian marriage is a sacred and serious commitment. Couples contemplating marriage should notify a parish priest at least nine months before the date on which they intend to marry. This should be done before any other arrangements are made so that a couple may be suitably served by the parish and diocese. All couples are required to take part in a Pre-Cana program or Engaged Encounter Weekend. **Sunday Weddings are not permitted.**

RCIA: The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is a community journey that leads to transformation of mind and spirit. Guided by the gospel and the examples of parish members, newcomers can find their place in the RCIA community of believers and discover their own relationship with Christ. The program runs from September through Pentecost with reception of the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Information is available at the parish office.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Knowing the Catholic faith and tradition is essential if faith and tradition are to continue to be nourishing facets of our lives. Religious formation is valuable for both youth and adults. Classes are conducted from September to May following the 9:00AM Mass on Sunday. Information on religious education programs for youth of all ages and educational opportunities for adults are available at the parish office.

BULLETIN: If you have information that you would like to place in the bulletin (community news, society/social news, etc.), please have it at the parish office no later than Tuesday morning.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Forty-five minutes before Saturday evening Mass or by appointment.

SHUT-INS: If someone you know is unable to attend Mass but would like to receive Communion or receive a copy of our weekly bulletin, please contact the parish office.

BAPTISMAL PREPARATION PROGRAM: All parents must attend a Baptismal Preparation meeting before this sacrament will be celebrated. Contact Father Pat at the parish office (570-836-3275) to schedule an appointment to discuss your child's baptism.

HOSPITAL VISITS: Visits are made on a regular basis.
PLEASE NOTE: The new privacy laws limit the amount of information that we receive from the hospitals or nursing/convalescent homes. It is necessary that family or friends notify us of these admittances.

HANDICAPPED SEATING AREA: Please note that the front pew nearest to the side door is reserved to accommodate those who have need due to disability. Please be kind enough to leave this pew available for that purpose.

PARKING LOT: [St. Mary's] Please keep the emergency lane in front of the church clear at all times. It is essential that vehicles are able to get in and out of the parking lot in case of an emergency. Please adhere to the parking spaces as delineated. Please be considerate of your fellow parishioners when you are backing up or turning to park or to exit the parking lot. There is ample parking on the upper level and supplemental parking on the side of the church.

FROM THE DEACON'S BENCH:

Brothers and Sisters,

Last month, on June 25th, we celebrated Father Pat's 25th anniversary as a priest in the Diocese of Scranton. Everyone had a great time as we affirmed our gratitude to Father for his willingness to offer up his life in the service of God and His Church. Now, while this was a great time, what a lot of people didn't know was that Father really wanted to be a Monk.



Many years before he became a priest, Pat (remember this was before his ordination into the priesthood) was driving through the Smoky Mountains late one night on his way back to Scranton when he ran out of gas. Not knowing what to do, he looked around and, off in the distance on top of the mountain, Pat saw a light. He grabbed the gas can out of the trunk of his car and went off in search of help. At the top of the mountain sat a house emitting the light he had seen. He knocked on the door of the house and an elderly monk answered and asked Pat how he could help him. Pat responded that his car had run out of gas. The old monk was a kind soul so he invited Pat to spend the night and in the morning would help him on his way.

After going to his room and, just before he turned off the light, Pat heard an awful scream that seemed to come from down in the cellar. It made his hair stand on end and he was covered in goose bumps. Not knowing what the cause of this frightful noise was, he placed a chair under the door knob and finally fell asleep. Come morning, he went and found the old monk and asked what the scream he heard had been from but was told only another monk could know about the cellar.

What would you do in this situation? Pat decided to tell the monk that he had always wanted to join. It's not that simple. The old monk told Pat he had to train for a year with them. Normal people would have left, giving up on knowing the answer to a mystery instead of giving a year of your life. Pat agreed because he decided he really did want to become a monk. Every night that year, Pat huddled in his bed, shaking with fear listening to the same blood curdling scream.

A year passed and Pat became a monk and asked the old monk to be shown the source of the screams. With a look that made Pat just as uneasy as the screams, the old monk placed a key in his hand but before letting it go, he again asked Pat if he was sure he wanted to know. After thinking for a moment, Pat said yes, took the key and started down the steps that lead to the basement door. As he descended the stairs, the screams began in

earnest, growing louder and more horrifying with each step. By the time Pat reached the bottom, he was covered in sweat and his hands shook uncontrollably. Someone else may have dropped the key and run from the noise, but not Pat. He had to know what was screaming. He put the key in the door, turned the lock and pushed the door open. There in the dark was ... I can't tell you because you're not a monk ...sorry.

If you cannot join in the fun, but you would like to send a resident in your place, please be sure to support our *Sponsor a Resident* program, which is \$35.00.



NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR:

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis or at 1-800-932-0313.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska, at 570-862-7551 or to Diocesan officials, including the Vicar General, Msgr. Thomas M. Muldowney, V.G., at 570-207-2269.

 - Look up information from the current bulletin or old bulletins.
 - Explore the "Our Catholic Faith" section. Did you know that "digital learning" is one of the principal ways that adult Catholics now learn about and strengthen their faith? This section of the website contains such things as:
 - A listing of common Catholic prayers.
 - Curated links to many Catholic websites.
 - "Catholic Link". This is a blog with three blog posts that change weekly. Frequently included are several reflections on the readings from that week's Mass.
 - Catholic Gift Shop. Since The Guild Store in Scranton closed, it is very difficult to find Catholic

gifts for such things as Baptisms, First Communions, Confirmations, Weddings, Christmas, etc. This section contains links to seven of the most popular online Catholic gift stores for online ordering.



Bishop Joseph C. Bambera invites the faithful to join him on a special pilgrimage to Spain and Portugal in honor of the 100th anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima's appearance to three young shepherd children in 1917. **The pilgrimage will take place September 18-26, 2017 and will include Masses celebrated by the Bishop and visits to many sacred and historic sites, including nearly two days in Fatima where the Marian apparitions occurred.**



The Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, appeared six times to the children – Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta – near the town of Fatima, Portugal between May 13 and October 13, 1917. During a time of war and turmoil, she told them that she had been sent by God with a message that Heaven would grant peace to all the world if her requests for prayer, reparation and consecration were heard and obeyed. 
