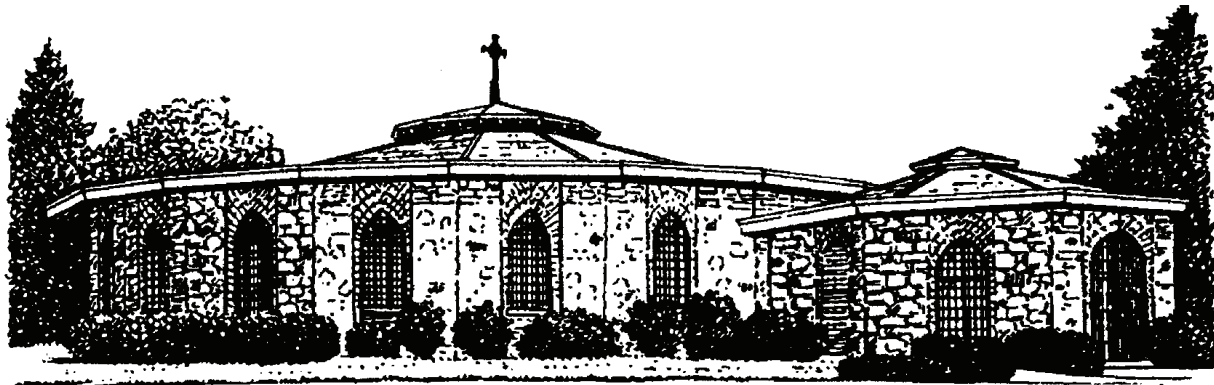

The word “mine” did not exist in my home. Beside the fact that we were an immigrant family with four readily growing boys and money was tight, my father constantly taught us that sharing is integral to our individual and familiar dignity. According to him, sharing our things with others is a fundamental part of what it means to truly be a man and to be a member of our family. In doing so, we learn to graciously give to others, and to receive from them, presenting ourselves and our family in the best possible light.

So when someone shares with me something important to his or her faith, it is a great joy for me as well. Recently, one of parishioners, Marc Mirabella, gave me this gift when he reminded me of some important words the newly canonized saint, Teresa of Calcutta:

People are often unreasonable, illogical and self-centered. **Forgive them anyway.**

If you are kind, people may accuse you of selfish ulterior motives.

Be kind anyway.

If you are successful, you will win some false friends and some true enemies.

Succeed anyway.

If you are honest and frank, people may cheat you.

Be honest and frank anyway.

What you spend years building, Someone could destroy overnight.

Build anyway.

If you find serenity and happiness, They may be jealous.

Be happy anyway.

The good you do today, People will often forget tomorrow.

Do good anyway.

Give the world the best you have, And it may never be enough.

Give the best you’ve got anyway.

You see,

In the final analysis it is between you and God; It was never between you and them anyway.

These words from Mother Teresa remind us that we don’t do good to make other people happy, because we are all flawed individuals living complex realities. We do the right and the good because, as children of God and as members of the Church, it is an expressing our love and gratitude to God for His love for us.

So don’t do the good in order to make other people happy, or in expectation of a payback. Do the right thing because that is who you are.

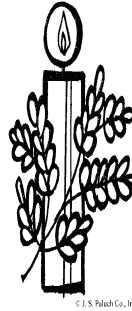

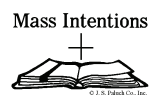
