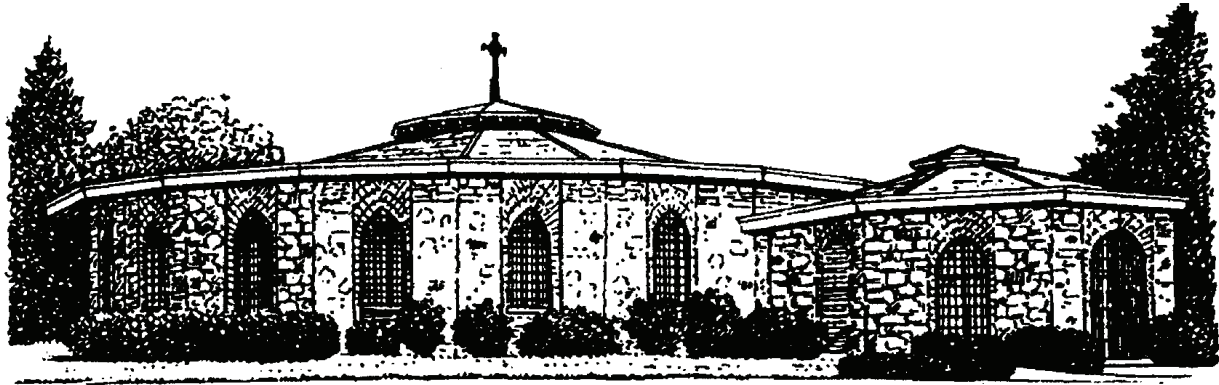

FACING THE ISSUE: Angry, hurt, and confused people filled the parish hall downstairs. It was 2002, and the news had just broken of the pedophile scandals involving priests. Our community was just as shocked as everyone else to hear the tragic stories of children being harmed. Thankfully, Fr. Lucian offered the parish an open forum where we all could gather and begin to process our feelings. This night remains an important memory of my first time in Transfiguration.

Since that time, the Church has taken serious steps to ensure that all people feel safe and secure. All people working for the Church must have background checks done and also attend classes on maintaining a safe environment, even if they are volunteers. Still there is much to do. To that end, the Archdiocese has formed an *Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program* that will assist victims of sexual abuse by the clergy in their process of healing. Mr. Kenneth Feinberg, and his associate, Ms. Camille Biros, head the program and will begin to deal with those whose cases have already substantiated allegations. In addition, an *independent Oversight Committee* will ensure the proper implementation and administration of the program. Former Police Commissioner Raymond W. Kelly, U.S. District Judge Loretta A. Preska, and Associate Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at Columbia University Jeanette Cueva, M.D., an expert in child psychiatry, will serve as this board. 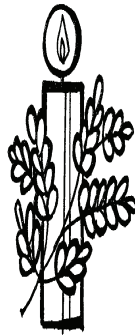
