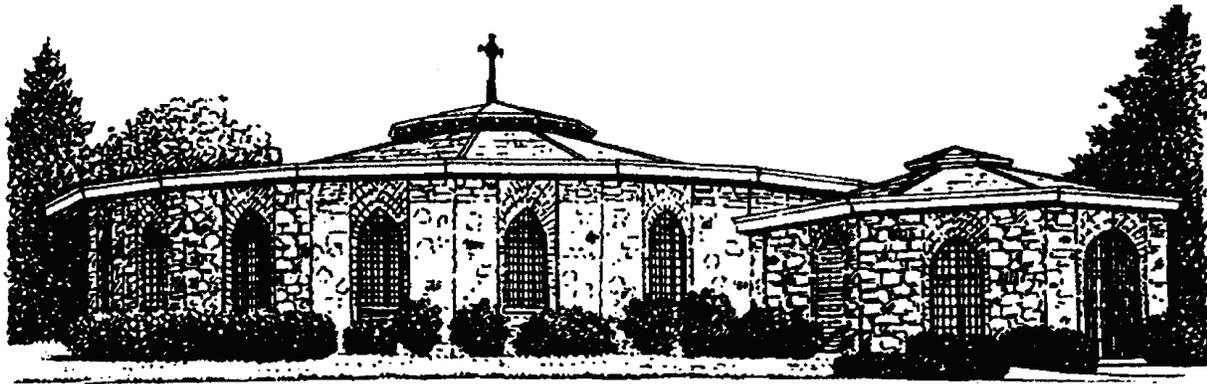

THE TIME I COULDN'T FIGURE OUT ONE END FROM THE OTHER: Many of us have done things in our lives that, looking back on them now, we can't figure out for the life of us how we managed to mess up so badly. More importantly, with the distance of time, we can laugh at our foolishness. One of my silly stunts had to do with a school project and the simple act of pushing a straight pin through a piece of cardboard. I don't recall exactly what I was supposed to be making. But I remember that the card was quite thick. So I attempted a few times to force the pin through but nothing happened, except for the mounting stress and the pain in the tip of my finger. After many fruitless trials, I decided to give it one last go. And so with all the strength in my hand, I tried to force the pin into the cardboard, managing only to leave a dint. Suddenly, I discovered that my finger was bleeding. Turning the wounded appendage over, I realized that I had been pushing the wrong end, and was actually pushing the pin into my finger. After bandaging my wounded appendage and turning the pin the right way round, the pin went through the cardboard without any problem whatsoever. I thought of this after I made my confession this afternoon at St. Peter's.

As children, we are taught to prepare ourselves for the sacrament by looking at the Ten Commandments and how we have offended God by our behavior. For some of us, this also meant recalling the number of times each offense was committed. When we as adults use this method, we see confession similar to the fruitless driving of the pin, repeating the same actions without noticing a lot of change.

For adults, confession is an opportunity to really think about the way we live our Christian lives and to understand them, even our sins, in order that we might understand ourselves a little better, to love God and our fellow men and women in a deeper and more profound way, and to accept ourselves ourselves a bit more as imperfect creatures profoundly loved by the Divine. When we can "turn over the wounded finger," as it were, and discover the roots of our painful sinfulness, then we begin to look at these wounds through God's eyes, in the context of our whole lives, and with the possibilities for a real transformation. In this way, we can discover the joy of God's healing and the beauty of His mercy.

So as I was preparing for the sacrament, which I try to receive monthly, I also prayed for you all, the parishioners, that God might hear the needs and concerns, hopes and aspirations that you hold in your hearts, and that you might also be able to know the gift of the sacrament of reconciliation as an important tool in becoming better and more joyful disciples of our Lord.

One of the important aspects of confession is going to a priest you can trust. Therefore, I offer you the schedule of confession time of our cluster parishes:


