

Our St. Vincent de Paul Conference has had a busy three months. During November, December, and January we spent approximately \$4200 helping our Chico neighbors with rent and utilities. At the same time, along with many generous volunteers from both Our Divine Savior and St. John's, we had a 8-10 hours a day, 6-7 days a week presence at the Camp Fire Relief Center in the Sears Building. From November 16, 2018 to January 11, 2019 we did intake interviews and handed out gift cards to 4640 persons, providing 2976 hours of volunteers service.
