CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING CORNER

In the first reading today, Chronicles reminds us of what happened to the Israelites when they ignored the prophets. In the Gospel Jesus tells Nicodemus that God sent His son not to condemn the world, but to save it. We know that the message of the prophets was about right relationships: living in a way that protects the poor and vulnerable. We know that the message of Jesus at the end of John's Gospel is also about relationships. We who are disciples of Jesus caught up in God's love and are called to live that love with all. Is our love growing this Lent? How are we showing God's love, particularly for the poor and vulnerable?

HOLY THURSDAY OR MAUNDY THURSDAY

"Maundy" from either the Latin "*mandatum*" ("command"), in the sense of the New Covenant entered into by Christ in the Paschal offering instituted in the Eucharist, or possibly from Middle English "*maund*", referring to a basket held by beggars. Referring to Holy Thursday as "Maundy Thursday" is a particularly English usage, but one that has been taken up by other denominations through its use in Anglicanism.

CHRISM MASS

Usually transferred to the Tuesday of Holy Week, this Mass is where the holy oils (the Sacred Chrism, the Oil of the Sick, and the Oil of Catechumens) are consecrated (in the case of the Chrism) or blessed (in the case of the other two oils) by the ordinary bishop of the diocese. It is celebrated with the whole of the presbyterate of the diocese, who are asked to renew the promises made at their ordination before the assembled faithful of the local church. The whole of the Church is present, visibly united in this Mass, with the bishop, the priests and deacons who work with him among the people, all of whom are invited to attend this Mass. As with the later Mass of the day (the

Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday), the particular focus of the Mass is on Christ's priesthood.

MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

It is with the evening Mass that the shortest season of the liturgical year, Triduum, begins. This Mass draws the particulars of the institution of the Eucharist into greater focus and highlights the unique role of the ministerial priesthood in the Church. The 'Washing of the Feet' of twelve members of the parish is more than just a 'play-acting' of Christ washing the feet of the disciples at the Last Supper, but is a renewal of purpose for the ordained (to remember the command to look after those of the Household of Faith entrusted to their care) and a call to humility and service for all the baptized ('As I have done, you also must do'). In the same way that not everyone in the church comes forward to bring the gifts to the altar but must prayerfully unite their own offering of self with those who do bring up the gifts, so too all are called to prayerfully unite themselves with those who are having their feet washed in order to be open to the graces of growing in humility and openness to service. No bells are rung from the *Gloria* of Holy Thursday until the *Gloria* of the Easter Vigil. Instead of the bells rung at the *epiklesis* and elevation of the Host and Chalice in the Liturgy of the Eucharist, a *crotalus* (Latin for "rattle"), a wooden hammer, or slapstick is traditionally used, which anticipates Christ's scourging before He was condemned on Good Friday. At the conclusion of the liturgy, the holy water fonts are emptied in preparation for the Easter Vigil, the altar is stripped bare for Good Friday, and the Eucharist is reserved elsewhere with a solemn procession, exposed for a period of Adoration so that we might 'stay awake' with Christ as the disciples tried to do in Gethsemane the night before His Passion. There is no dismissal from the Mass as the liturgical action continues throughout the whole of Triduum.
