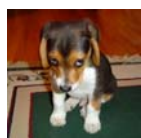

SAINTS MICHAEL, GABRIEL, AND RAPHAEL

SAINT OF THE DAY FOR SEPTEMBER 29

SAINTS MICHAEL, GABRIEL, AND RAPHAEL'S STORY

Angels—messengers from God—appear frequently in Scripture, but only Michael, Gabriel and Raphael are named.

Michael appears in Daniel's vision as "the great prince" who defends Israel against its enemies; in the *Book of Revelation*, he leads God's armies to final victory over the forces of evil.

Devotion to Michael is the oldest angelic devotion, rising in the East in the fourth century. The Church in the West began to observe a feast honoring Michael and the angels in the fifth century.

Gabriel also makes an appearance in Daniel's visions, announcing Michael's role in God's plan. His best-known appearance is an encounter with a young Jewish girl named Mary, who consents to bear the Messiah.

Raphael's activity is confined to the Old Testament story of Tobit. There he appears to guide Tobit's son Tobiah through a series of fantastic adventures which lead to a threefold happy ending: Tobiah's marriage to Sarah, the healing of Tobit's blindness, and the restoration of the family fortune.

The memorials of Gabriel and Raphael were added to the Roman calendar in 1921. The 1970 revision of the calendar joined their individual feasts to Michael's.

REFLECTION

Each of the archangels performs a different mission in Scripture: Michael protects; Gabriel announces; Raphael guides. Earlier belief that inexplicable events were due to the actions of spiritual beings has given way to a scientific world-view and a different sense of cause and effect. Yet believers still experience God's protection, communication, and guidance in ways which defy description. We cannot dismiss angels too lightly.

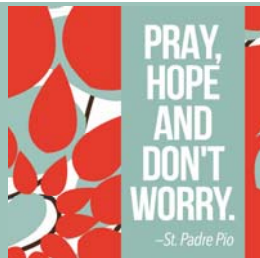
Article 4 of the CCC: "Catechesis is an *education in the faith*... which includes especially teaching of Christian doctrine imparted in a systematic way."

REFLECTION.



Those who are continually learning about their faith through daily prayer, bible study, and regular Mass attendance and are considered to be devout Catholics.

True catechesis is lifelong. True catechesis demands there be times of systematic learning and an intentional commitment to grow in our knowledge of the Blessed Trinity from which all truth flows. 11. Be hospitable. Invite, welcome, and engage others as a Catholic lifestyle.



12. Mention your faith in public. Don't be afraid to tell your story. Your life is your experience of faith.

Recognize where "God has broken in". Tell others. Feel free to speculate on a recent "God moment".

13. Say "thank God", "I believe", or "amen" in public.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

FEAST DAY: SEPTEMBER 27



Although he was born to humble beginnings, Vincent was quite bright and strived to better himself. He studied with the Franciscans, was ordained at the early age of 19 and worked as a chaplain to the Queen. When the powerful de Gondi family hired him as a tutor and spiritual director, Vincent was pleased.

Then, after he heard the confession of a dying peasant on the de Gondi estate, Vincent's life changed. Shocked by the man's ignorance of religion, Vincent preached about confession at the local chapel. Soon, the lines for confession were so long that he needed help. The people clearly wanted to learn about God but needed priests to educate them. So Vincent founded the congregation of the Mission to bring the word of God to the poor in rural areas.

VISION OF SOLACE FOR ALL

This core of priests were the beginning of Vincent's much greater vision. Word of their goodwill spread to the cities, and people, especially women, volunteered. He organized another group called the Ladies of Charity, with women from all walks of life taking active roles. Women of nobility raised money to support Vincent's various charitable groups; while others, who would eventually become the Daughters of Charity, helped the sick, orphans, emotionally ill and homeless.

In his lifetime, Vincent founded hospitals; organized retreats, which evolved into 11 seminaries; ministered to convicts; and sent his priests to train others around the world. Upon his death, all of France mourned. But Vincent's legacy lives on. Through him, the world realized that God's love could reach all people.

In 1833, nearly 200 years after Vincent's death, a law student named Frederick Ozanam, founded the Society of St. Vincent de Paul to continue Vincent's mission.

Today, the society can be found in almost every corner of the world. Its loving goal is to give laypeople the opportunity to serve and offer spiritual support to the needy and suffering. Called Vincentians, members come from every economic level, ethnic and cultural background and age group. Besides visiting with the poor, sick, elderly and physically challenged, some of the services the society offers are:

- Money and housing to people in emergency situations.
- Individual counseling.
- Soup kitchens, food pantries and thrift stores.
- Relief for victims of natural disasters.
