Service Projects

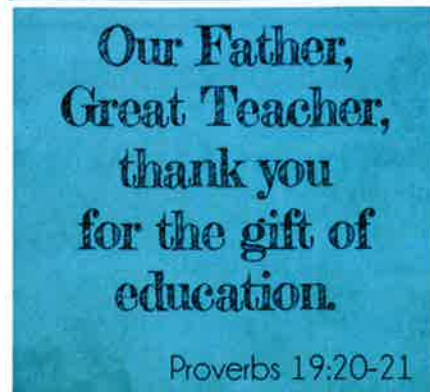
