## Faith leaders using social media

Diocesan clergy take to the interwebs

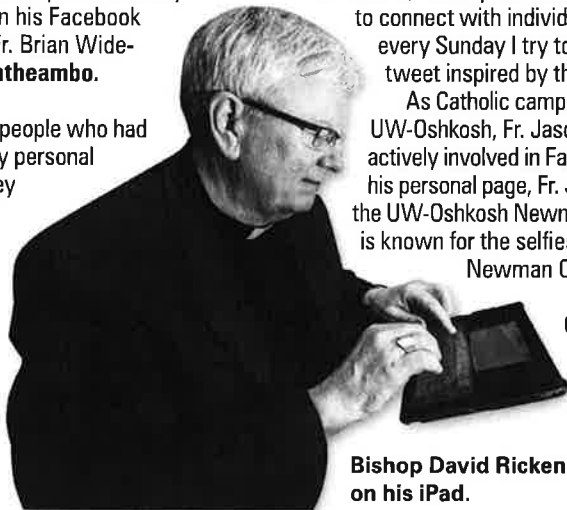

**GREEN BAY** — Like it or not, social media is here to stay. And according to Bishop David Ricken, if you want to be relevant to the current generation, you have to be in those places. That's exactly what some priests in the Green Bay Diocese (and Bishop Ricken) are doing.

Fr. Brian Wideman, 39, parochial vicar of Sacred Heart Parish, Appleton, was ordained in 2014. He admits to not being much of a social media user before. Now he posts his daily and Sunday homilies on his Facebook page under the name Fr. Brian Wideman and his blog, [fromtheambo.blogspot.com](http://fromtheambo.blogspot.com).

"There were enough people who had seen my homilies on my personal Facebook page, and they seemed to like to be able to read them, so I thought that would be a good thing to do with my daily homilies," Fr. Wideman said.

He said other people use social media more as an evangelizing tool, but it is not a

substitute for interpersonal communication.


Like Pope Francis, Bishop David Ricken is an active presence on Twitter (@BpDavidRicken). "Social media is an important way that we communicate today, and it's important to me that we as disciples are personally present in these digital places. We are called to be salt and light everywhere, and that means being on Twitter and other places, too," Bishop Ricken said.

"My purpose in tweeting is close to my calling in life — to be a disciple of Jesus. And just as I share the joy and life that I have in Jesus Christ with others in person, I hope that I'm sharing it with others on Twitter," Bishop Ricken said. "I use Twitter to connect with individuals in prayer, and every Sunday I try to post some sort of tweet inspired by that week's Gospel."

As Catholic campus ministry director at UW-Oshkosh, Fr. Jason Blahnik, 35, is also actively involved in Facebook both through his personal page, Fr. Jason Blahnik, and the UW-Oshkosh Newman Center page. He is known for the selfies he posts on the Newman Center page.

## Sisters dedicate solar energy project same day pope releases encyclical

**BAY SETTLEMENT** — The Sisters of St. Francis of the Holy Cross selected the perfect day for the dedication of their solar array. The blessing, held on June 18, coincided with the release of "Laudato Si, on Care for Our Common Home," the much anticipated encyclical on the environment by Pope Francis.

"I think God had something to do with our choosing this day and the pope choosing this day," said Sr. Rose Jochmann, chair of the committee

that worked on the solar energy project for the last two years. The 112-kilowatt solar photovoltaic system on the motherhouse property features 416 solar panels. Each panel is made up of 60 solar cells that produce earth-friendly energy.

"We wanted a concrete way of showing our Franciscan value of care for all creation and also to continue the sustainability that we try to incorporate in our building," said Sr. Rose. "We also wanted to use energy in our building that was completely green, renewable, no pollution and not using natural resources."

The sisters flipped the switch for solar energy on June 5, 2014. Since then, the solar array has provided approximately 28 percent of the electricity used in the motherhouse.

The dedication launched the final phase of the solar project: educating others about solar and renewable energy. The site is now open to visitors for self-guided tours from May to October. Groups of five or more are asked to make an appointment by calling (920) 468-1828.

About Queenship of Mary feast

- 1 This is one of the newer feasts of Our Lady. Pope Pius XII placed it on the universal calendar of the church in 1954.
- 2 Pius XII had declared Mary's Assumption as dogma (a church teaching that requires belief) four years earlier, in 1950.
- 3 This feast of Mary's queenship was originally celebrated on May 31.
- 4 With liturgical reforms of Vatican II, the feast was moved, in 1969, to the octave (eighth day after) of the Assumption.
- 5 In ancient Israel, the king's mother was called *hrybg* (pronounced "gheb-ee-raw"), meaning "great lady."

## THE HOME AS A SCHOOL OF PRAYER, LOVE

Each household in our diocese is a domestic church with a noble purpose, meaning and special place in the Body of Christ. The home is a church in miniature. My mother used to say that a house is just a house until the family invests love and prayer in it, then it becomes a home. The "families" within our homes come in many

different varieties. Currently, my sister Carol and I make up our household. I have lived by myself and with others. Whoever lives in our home is invited into a deeper relationship of love and prayer with our Lord.

During this year, July 2015 to June 2016, I would ask that you continue to seek ways to pray together in your household and grow to love the Lord and the church. I especially ask you to transform your home into a school of prayer and love by making the Holy Family of Jesus, Joseph and Mary your model and example. In the words of St. John Paul II, the mission of the family is to "guard, reveal and



communicate love" (1) and the family serves as a school of compassion, respect, humility and forgiveness in the midst of a world darkened by self-absorption, conflict and selfishness. Whether you live by yourself or with others, your home is a household of faith where Christ is at the center of your life.

The Holy Father will be present personally at the "World Meeting on the Family" in Philadelphia in September. He has also called for another Synod of Bishops in October in Rome to help develop strategies for marriages and families during these highly stressful times for families. As a diocese, we are committed to sharing with you some of these insights and strategies so that you can truly cultivate a household where faith is the foundation of your home.
