

Anointing of the Sick

The Anointing of the Sick is the Sacrament in which the Church prays for and anoints with sacred oil those who are gravely ill, asking for strength and healing.

Oil of the Sick

The Holy Oil used in the Anointing of the Sick. This oil is a sign of nourishment, healing, and strength.

Sacramental Graces

The supernatural help we receive from God through the Sacraments. In the Anointing of the Sick, God gives us the grace to accept our illness and die a good death.

Viaticum

Eucharist that is given to the dying. A sacrament of “passing over” from this life to eternal life.

The Triduum

The Triduum begins with evening Mass on Holy Thursday and ends with Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday. (The Holiest Days of the Year)

Holy Saturday

The Easter Vigil is the greatest celebration in the entire Church year. (Vigil of the Lord's Resurrection)

Holy Thursday

On this night we celebrate the Institution of the Eucharist and Holy Orders, as well as the worth Christ gave to humble service. (Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper)

Good Friday
