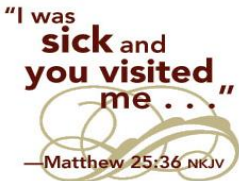

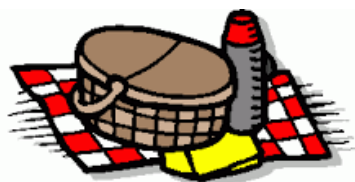

All Saints Parish Pastoral Council Minutes

Meeting was held July 6, 2016 at the rectory from 6:00 PM to 8:30 PM.

The following attended: Fr. Jacek Bialkowski, Pat Merman, Audrey Kocher, John Sipper Jr., Marina Kopko, Doreen Kolojejchick, Kathy Narcum, Marsha Sipper, Alma Butler, Jackie Karnes, and Tammy Walker.

The meeting was opened by John Sipper Jr with an opening prayer by the Parish Council members. The Minutes of the June 8, 2016 meeting, were approved.

Invited guests Mike and Rachel Young were introduced to the Parish Council. They discussed the information previously sent to members about a program that takes place at St. Monica's Parish that our parish may be interested in.

Faith sharing was led by Father Jacek. We need to instill a sense of family. Focus on mercy.

Father Jacek reported:

- We cannot undertake the newly introduced St. Monica's Parish program at this time.
- The demolition of the convent is complete which will save money with the insurance costs.
- The parking lot will be paved in about a year after the ground settles.
- The trees have been removed.
- The two chimneys on the top of the rectory are crumbling and need repointing so they do not fall.
- Cleanup day is coming on July 23 at 10:45 AM. 13yrs and older welcome. Wear gloves and old clothes.

Committee Reports:

Word: They will meet in the fall.

Worship: Cleanup will take place July 23. They will meet in the fall.

Community: Bereavement reorganization meeting took place. Sandy Bonawits is the new leader of the Bereavement Committee. John made a suggestion for a uniform bereavement card. Audrey will take this recommendation to the core group. The Friendship Club will be the sponsors for September coffee and doughnuts. The Pastoral Council will be sponsors for October coffee and doughnuts.

The council reviewed the Pastoral five-year plan and designated time frames for all stages of development.

New items: Jackie Karnes will be the representative for the service committee.

The next meeting will be held Wednesday August 17 at 6:00 PM at the rectory.

A Closing prayer was shared by all council members.

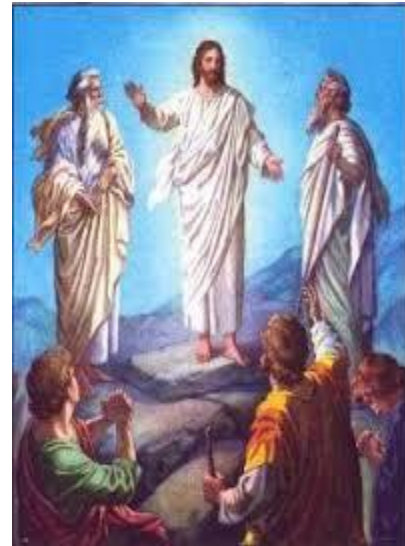

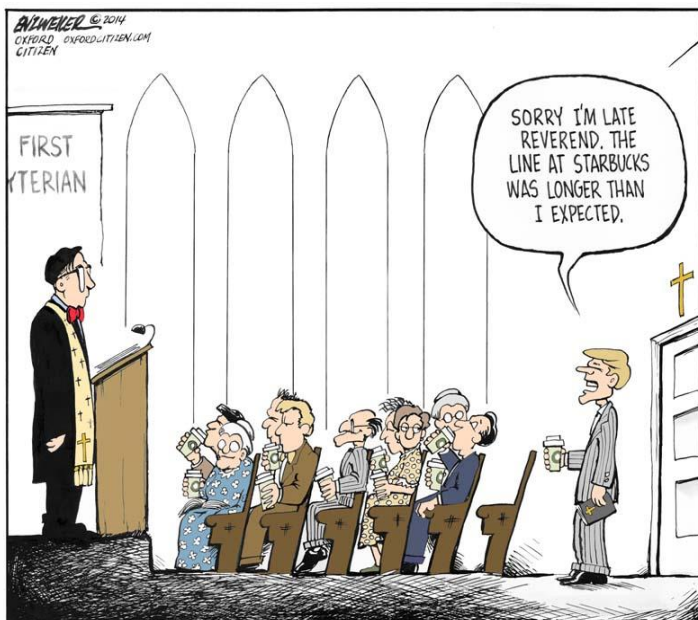
