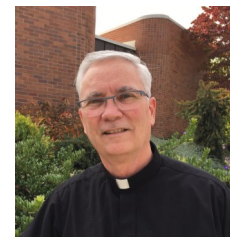

A Word from Father...



Dear Friends:

On Tuesday, August 2nd, I will be catching a plane and winging my way to Guatemala for a couple of weeks. I have had folks ask me what I am going to be doing there and why am I going and is this a vacation? Let me try to answer...

When I was a very young priest, still in my twenties, I first visited my friend, Father David Baronti, in his village of Santa Catarina Ixtahuacán and fell in love with the place and even more with the people I was privileged to meet. It was clearly a poor place by our Western standards, but the people were just wonderful to be with, that the "missionary spirit" in me was spurred. A few years later, the opportunity came for me to actually serve there; Father Brian Mee was ending his six-year assignment and I was appointed by Bishop Welsh to take his place. I spent the better part of a year there, a few months in Nahaulá, but mostly in Ixtahuacán. It was a powerful experience for me, but for a number of reasons, I felt it was important for me to come home after just a little less than a year.

I have returned on occasion in the decades since and more regularly in recent years. I especially love Ixtahuacán and many of the folks who were just children back when I lived there are now well into adulthood and have kids of their own. We remain great friends and I enjoy being among them as well as the many elders and the new generation of children who populate the deep and lovely valley where Ixtahuacán is located.

I have a couple of "to do's" while I am there. Some good friends of mine from Belgium, Gene and Caroline Foley, are supporting a young woman of the town in her nursing studies and I have to visit her and bring back to them a report on how it is going for her. I am also carrying down a couple suitcases filled with surplus Mass vestments from some of our Spokane area parishes to be shared out among the various chapels served by Father David and Sister Marie Tolle. While there, I will have some time to read and take some energetic walks through the hills (at 8,000' above sea level, the oxygen is fairly thin and so I have to huff and puff to get up those hills!), I will pick up a number of Masses for Father David, especially on the weekends, and I will have time to just visit with old and dear friends.

They always assure me that they pray for my family and parishioners up here...and they do...so I invite you to return the favor by keeping them in your prayers, too. They have many challenges to face and life is seldom easy, so your prayers are important to them. Is this my idea of a vacation? Yes it is, because their spirit of kindness, humility, and simple love energize me and make these weeks among them a time of grace and renewal for me.

I will be back for the weekend Masses on August 20-21. See you then!
