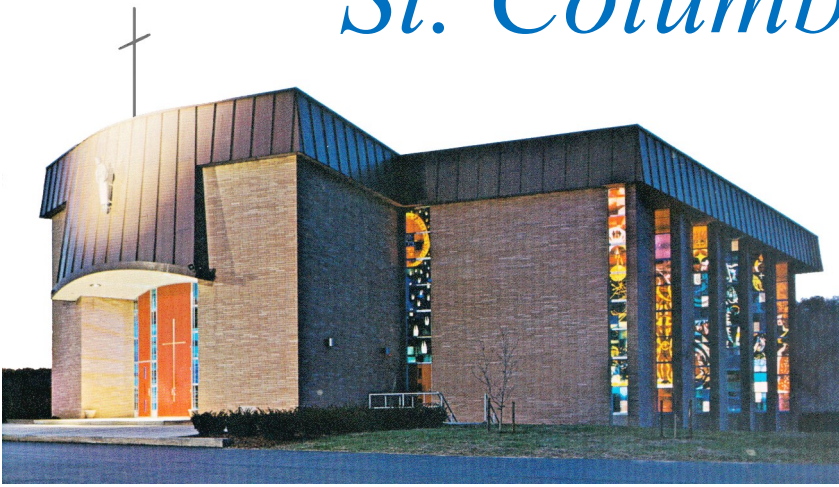

LENTEN REGULATIONS

During the season of Lent, all are urged to reflect a spirit of penance in their daily lives by performing acts of fasting and abstinence.

Abstinence prohibits eating meat on all Fridays during Lent. Those aged 14 and over should abstain from meat. Good Friday is a day of fasting.

Fasting requires only one full meal be taken per day; two smaller meals may be taken but together should not equal one full meal. Everyone aged 18 through 59 should fast.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS & BENEDICTION SCHEDULE

St. Columbanus Church: Holy Hour at 6:00 p.m. and Stations of the Cross at 7:00 p.m. every Friday through the Lenten season.

North American Martyrs Church: Stations at 3:00 p.m. every Wednesday afternoon beginning Wednesday, February 21st through the Lenten season.

~PASTORS NOTES~

This week we will begin the holy and awesome season of Lent. Lent comes from an Old English word for the season of spring. With the winter we are having, the idea of spring is a welcome one. Lent, however is a penitential season in the Church by which we prepare ourselves to commemorate and share spiritually in the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus.

Ash Wednesday, February 14, begins Lent. We receive the ashes made from burning last year's palms, reminding us that "we are dust and unto dust we shall return."

We are asked to fast on only two days: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. **Fasting consists in limiting how much we eat** by taking one normal size meal and two smaller meals that together are not greater than the main meal.



We are also called to abstain from eating meat on **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and on all the Fridays of Lent**. The Church gives us in her liturgy some minor hints of sacrifice. The Gloria will not be sung, no flowers are in the sanctuary, and even the music takes on a somber tone with limited use of the organ.

We are to share in the penitential nature of Lent by our own private acts of penance, prayer and almsgiving. Let us take Lent seriously. Many of our luxuries we consider necessities and we take for granted the blessings we've been given. Perhaps we can put aside the computer, texting, or TV and spend some time as a family in prayer (especially the rosary) and spiritual reading. It can't hurt and can only help foster the presence of Christ in our families and parish.
