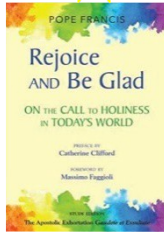

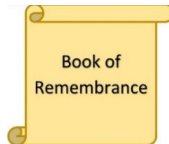

The predator then begins to separate the teen from her/his safety nets, leaving the teen vulnerable to be forced into prostitution or other forms of slavery.

**FAMILY IDEAS**

We pray the Penitential Act together at Mass. One form of it begins, “I confess to Almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters...” What we do or fail to do affects other people. When we do not reach out a helping hand or we ignore injustices done to others, we are not living as God created us to live.

- **Be sure your children understand that God will always forgive us when we ask. We don't have to earn forgiveness. God loves us with an unending love and will never turn away from us. God is a God of mercy and love. We can trust our God always.**
- **Talk with your children about living in peace. We are called to share God's forgiveness with others. We can be peacemakers by using our words and actions to bring healing and not hurt to others. Talk about how to do this together as a family.**

**A CALL TO HOLINESS BY POPE FRANCIS.**

13. This should excite and encourage us to give our all and to embrace that unique plan that God willed for each of us from eternity: “Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you” (*Jer 1:5*).

14. To be holy does not require being a bishop, a priest or a religious. We are frequently tempted to think that holiness is

only for those who can withdraw from ordinary affairs to spend much time in prayer. That is not the case. We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, wherever we find ourselves. Are you called to the consecrated life? Be holy by living out your commitment with joy. Are you married? Be holy by loving and caring for your husband or wife, as Christ does for the Church. Do you work for a living? Be holy by labouring with integrity and skill in the service of your brothers and sisters. Are you a parent or grandparent? Be holy by patiently teaching the little ones how to follow Jesus. Are you in a position of authority? Be holy by working for the common good and renouncing personal

gain.<sup>[14]</sup>
