LAWN MINISTRY



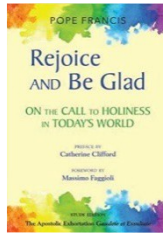

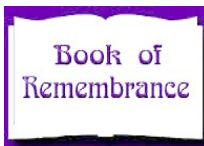

Help put an **END** to **Human Trafficking** –

Know and support anti-trafficking laws

Did you know...

Both federal and state laws define human trafficking as the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harboring, or receipt of persons by improper means (such as force, abduction, fraud, or coercion) for an improper purpose including forced labor or sexual exploitation. For persons under age 18, force, fraud and coercion are not required as proof of trafficking (there is no such thing as a “child prostitute”). A person is also considered to be engaging in human trafficking if they employ someone who they know is being trafficked. State and federal and

officials are working to combat human trafficking and provide services to trafficking survivors. Legislators need to hear our voice for the strengthening of laws and support of bills to be passed.

ASK FORGIVENESS: PENITENTIAL ACT.

FAMILY IDEAS

We pray the Penitential Act together at Mass. One form of it begins, "I confess to Almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters..." What we do or fail to do affects other people. When we do not reach out a helping hand or we ignore injustices done to others, we are not living as God created us to live.

- **Be sure your children understand that God will always forgive us when we ask. We don't have to earn forgiveness. God loves us with an unending love and will never turn away from us. God is a God of mercy and love. We can trust our God always.**
- **Talk with your children about living in peace. We are called to share God's forgiveness with others. We can be peacemakers by using our words and actions to bring healing and not hurt to others. Talk about how to do this together as a family.**

FAMILY PRAYER

God of second chances, we know that you call us to live in peace in our family and in our world. We ask your forgiveness for the times in our lives when we have hurt other people by our words or actions. Guide us to live always with love for others in our lives and in our hearts. Amen.

FOR FIRST COMMUNION FAMILIES

One way to get ready to celebrate First communion is to forgive people in our lives who have hurt us. This does not mean that what they did was right, but grudges only hurt the people who hold them. Ask your child to think of ways to let go of anger, such as listening to music or talking to someone they trust.

A CALL TO HOLINESS BY POPE FRANCIS.

15. Let the grace of your baptism bear fruit in a path of holiness. Let everything be open to God; turn to him in every situation. Do not be dismayed, for the power of the Holy Spirit enables you to do this, and holiness, in the end, is the fruit of the Holy Spirit in your life (cf. *Gal* 5:22-23). When you feel the temptation to dwell

on your own weakness, raise your eyes to Christ crucified and say: “Lord, I am a poor sinner, but you can work the miracle of making me a little bit better”. In the Church, holy yet made up of sinners, you will find everything you need to grow towards holiness. The Lord has bestowed on the Church the gifts of scripture, the sacraments, holy places, living communities, the witness of the saints and a multifaceted beauty that proceeds from God’s love, “like a bride bedecked with jewels” (*Is* 61:10).

16. This holiness to which the Lord calls you will grow through small gestures. Here is an example: a woman goes shopping, she meets a neighbour and they begin to speak, and the gossip starts. But she says in her heart: “No, I will not speak badly of anyone”. This is a step forward in holiness. Later, at home, one of her children wants to talk to her about his hopes and dreams, and even though she is tired, she sits down and listens with patience and love. That is another sacrifice that brings holiness. Later she experiences some anxiety, but recalling the love of the Virgin Mary, she takes her rosary and prays with faith. Yet another path of holiness. Later still, she goes out onto the street, encounters a poor person and

stops to say a kind word to him. One more step.



UN LLAMADO A LA SANTIDAD DEL PAPA FRANCISCO.

15. Deja que la gracia de tu Bautismo fructifique en un camino de santidad. Deja que todo esté abierto a Dios y para ello opta por él, elige a Dios una y otra vez. No te desalientes, porque tienes la fuerza del Espíritu Santo para que sea posible, y la santidad, en el fondo, es el

fruto del Espíritu Santo en tu vida (cf. *Ga* 5,22-23). Cuando sientas la tentación de enredarte en tu debilidad, levanta los ojos al Crucificado y dile: «Señor, yo soy un pobrecillo, pero tú puedes realizar el milagro de hacerme un poco mejor». En la Iglesia, santa y compuesta de pecadores, encontrarás todo lo que necesitas para crecer hacia la santidad. El Señor la ha llenado de dones con la Palabra, los sacramentos, los santuarios, la vida de las comunidades, el testimonio de sus santos, y una múltiple belleza que procede del amor del Señor, «como novia que se adorna con sus joyas» (*Is* 61,10).
